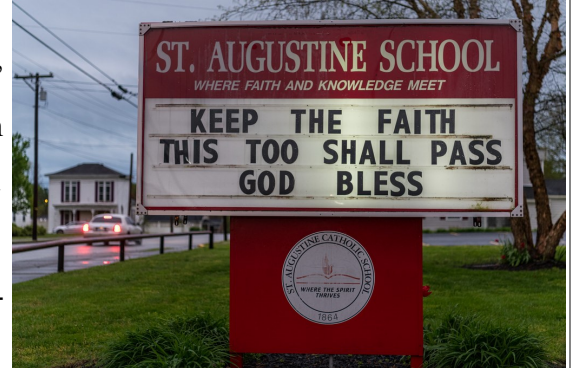

This Too Shall Pass!

As I considered what to write about the new year and our current situation, I was reminded of a book that I read years ago. It was written for people in sales whose incomes wax and wane with the economy and people's ability to make purchases. The take-away from that book was the expression "This, too, shall pass." It's applicability to the struggles of 2020 is obvious. Some people think it is from the Bible but it isn't. Others attribute the saying to Abraham Lincoln. Lincoln never took credit for that statement although he did say this about the phrase in an 1859 speech: "It is said an Eastern monarch once charged his wise men to invent a sentence which would be true and appropriate in all times and situations. They presented him with the words, "And this, too, shall pass away."



Indeed, that has been my experience in this world. Whatever *is* at any given time will "pass away" into something else. Dry years pass away into wet years. Times of plenty pass away into lean times. Profitable years pass away into years of loss. What is now, will not be in the future.

A recent Wired Word topic discussed this phrase and pared it with these words Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians in chapter 4:

"We know that the same God who brought the LORD Jesus back from death will bring us back to life again. . . . That is why we never give up. Though our bodies are dying, our inner strength in the LORD is growing every day. These troubles and sufferings of ours are, after all, quite small and won't last very long. . . . The troubles will soon be over, but the joys to come will last forever." (TLB)

We can live by Paul's words and apply them to the decidedly inconvenient times of most of 2020 and hopefully not more than the first half of 2021. While our human bodies are aging and becoming more fragile; the spirit of God within us is getting stronger and preparing us for the eternity which is to come. We don't have faith in what we can see; we have faith in what we cannot see. May your faith grow ever stronger in 2021.

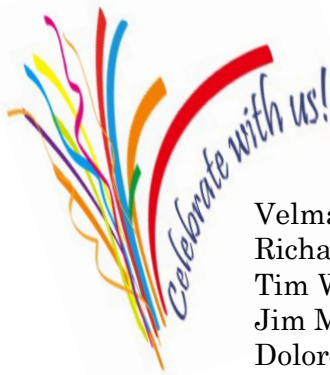

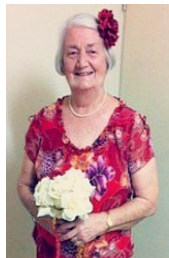
